Reading Scripture and looking at the Word through the eyes of Jesus, helps us to understand His will and His love for us. As you read and affirm (agree with) God's Word in your life and the lives of those for whom you are praying, you will learn that these words are trustworthy, perfect, right, desirable, and sweeter than honey. They transform our minds and our hearts as we integrate them into our lives. As we come to agree with what He says our faith is increased as we trust His Word and begin to speak it over, not only our lives and circumstances, but the lives of those for whom we pray. Your faith will grow as you trust His Word and speak it over your life and the lives of those for who you are praying. God watches over His Word to see that it's fulfilled. (Jeremiah 1:12) *"So is my word that goes out of my mouth: It will not return to me empty, but will achieve the purpose for which I sent it (Isaiah 55:1).* Learn to see people as God sees them.

Praise God as you pray! He will do the things He has promised in His Word.

"His divine power has given us everything we need for life and godliness through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness.
